



**END OF YEAR REPORTING 19/20**

ClubGRANTS is a state wide initiative that recognises the significant financial support for projects and services local Clubs make in contributing to the wellbeing of their communities. The ClubGRANTS round provides the opportunity for local projects to apply for funding from Campbelltown Clubs under the scheme. Campbelltown City Council and Sector Connect are responsible for overseeing the administration of ClubGRANTS in Campbelltown.

The Business Concierge Ltd	To provide the Survivor Life Skills program to 26 High Schools in the Macarthur Region - reaching approximately 3,530 young people. The program teaches students essential life skills and instils in them the knowledge needed in order to make informed and educated decisions regarding from finance to employment.	\$15,000.00
Healthy Kids Foundation	The Club paid the insurances for junior players of Softball Campbelltown. This enables a cheaper registration cost to families by individual sporting groups, thus allowing families to be able to afford for their children to participate in an active, healthy lifestyle in low social economic areas in the Campbelltown LGA. These payments are made direct to the Provider of the Insurance or the Governing Body of the sport. Further funds have been provided to 5 local Schools (Mary Brooksbank School, Eschol Park PS, Curran PS, Glenfield Park School and Ingleburn HS) to purchase replacement sporting equipment in their schools and therefore enhance their lunch time physical activity options for students.	\$6,889.30
Creating Chances	Creating Resilient Youth in Campbelltown. This project is part funded by Sarah Redfern High School. This program is tailored for disengaged young people at Sarah Redfern HS. The participants are from disadvantaged, CALD, low socioeconomic backgrounds. The program runs for 20 weeks from the Youth Development Pathway - Creating Champions and Creating Coaches. The program aims to improve student engagement, reduce peer related problems, improve cross cultural understanding.	\$7,500.00
Youth Solutions	Drug and Alcohol Information and Resilience Skills (DAIR) Program - a Youth Solutions health education program for young people aged 14-16. The program also engages with parents, carers and the wider school community. A series of workshops which focus on knowledge and skill development to reduce alcohol and other drug related harm.	\$5,000.00

Macarthur Disability Services	Each year MDS coordinates an Elders Olympics day for our local Indigenous Elders that promotes healthy lifestyles and enablement.	\$1,000.00
Leumeah Public School	The Club provided funds to (Leumeah Public School) to enable them to provide a Breakfast Club at their Schools which serves a free and healthy breakfast to a large number of students. Prior to this offering many students attended School without any food to sustain them for the day. Volunteer Teaching staff and other students help prepare and serve. It is proven that a healthy breakfast has seen less behavioural issues in the classroom and improved attendance by students who are now able to have something to eat at the beginning of the day. Schools rely on the local businesses for donations to enable them to purchase food supplies, storage containers, fridges, toasters etc, which these funds will contribute to.	\$2,000.00
